## An unexpected farewell

Doña Esther's grandson came to live with her after he got out of the drug rehabilitation center this past summer. She was 84 years old and the matriarch of our church

Last month, she took a terrible fall in the middle of the night. Thankfully, her grandson heard her and was able to call for help. She broke her hip and gashed her forehead terribly above her eye.

About a week later, five of us made the dark and lonely drive to the city hospital early in the morning to donate blood for her upcoming surgery. It wasn't expected to be a problem. But when she received the anesthesia, she had a heart attack and died.

Even though she was 84 years old, everyone was taken by surprise. The grandkids were in shock, and her children were angry. These last weeks have provided an important opportunity to anchor the believing family members in the Scripture's teaching about the resurrection of the dead and the 'blessed hope' we have in Jesus.
