

India

The Association of Free Lutheran Congregations - India (AFLC-I) is headquartered in Chirala, AP, India. The AFLC of India has 47 pastors and 55 congregations. Ministries of these congregations include:

- Bible Women they visit and lead Bible studies where, culturally, pastors are not able to minister.
- Theological Training The seminary equips laymen, pastors, and Bible women every month.
- Horeb Children's Ministry care for children through the local congregations and with your support.



Switzerland

In 2016, the AFLC Annual Conference approved a cooperative church planting effort with AFLC-Brazil and the El-Shadai Evangelical Lutheran Church of Geneva Switzerland. We are seeking to reach out to Switzerland and even greater Europe. The congregation is being served by lay pastor Augusto Fiuri. Pastor Augusto grew up in an AFLC-Brazil congregation but has relocated to Geneva with his family.

PLANT

We believe the best way for people to be reached for Christ and grow in Christ is to be part of a free and living local congregation. A congregation is people gathering to worship, where the Word of God is preached and taught, the sacraments are rightly administered, and there is organization. "Everything must be done so that the church may be built up" (I Corinthians 14:26).

EQUIP

We endeavor to quip nationals by the Word and Spirit of God to live out their faith and lead their congregations. "So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors, and teachers, to equip His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up" (Ephesians 4:11-12). Training the next generation of national pastors and leaders is vital. This is the purpose of ministries such as the Seminary in Brazil (SETELL), the Lutheran Seminary in India, and the Ambassador Institute.

WORLD MISSIONS DEPARTMENTS



Rev. Korhonen began as director in 2019. A part of AFLC Pastoral ministry since 1995, Earl has served congregations with his wife Joan in Washington, Wisconsin, and Iowa. The Korhonens are passionate about connecting congregations with the work of our AFLC Missions fields and church planting ministries of AFLC World Missions.

As the head of the Journey Missions' department of World Missions, Jon leads Ministry Trips and oversees the Missionary Assistant Program. Jon and his wife Heidi train these teams in addition to traveling with them. The Missionary Assistant Program sends individuals to various AFLC ministries around the world to serve alongside long-term missionaries for a set length of time.





Ambassador Institute is designed to bring solid biblical and theological education to classes operating in AFLC fields of work. Using an oral technique, Ambassador Institute emphasizes bible memory and storytelling. It is completed in six languages and available online.



Michel Rokenbrodt is a seasonal missionary, working with Ambassador Institute in Uganda for half the year and home as a student at the Free Lutheran Seminary for the rest of the year. Originally a teacher, he traveled to Uganda and has felt called back ever since. He was commissioned as an AFLC missionary in 2018. When Michael is in Uganda, his role is support to the national leaders. Michael has used his teaching gifts to assist with Ambassador Institute, going into any church that desires to receive the training. "Teaching with Ambassador Institute," Michael stated, "I get to continue to keep all the wonderful aspects of teaching that I love, all for the glory of God."

The Schierkolks are convinced that everyday discipleship with their community is not a short sprint but a marathon ministry.

The goal of Journey Missions is to point individuals to Christ and give them an opportunity to partner in His mission.

We facilitate two opportunities for short-term ministry:

- Short-Term Trips: Individuals and congregations train for and experience one to three-week ministry trips
- Missionary Assistant Program: Living cross-culturally and partnering with a missionary for a temporary time





Paul and Becky Abel have almost 40 years of ministry experience in Brazil. When they started their ministry, the main goal was to plant churches in the Parana region. Four churches have been established in Curitiba, Cajurú, Bateias, and Campo Largo, some of which began as small home Bible studies and are now thriving churches led by local pastors. The Abels have seen the grace of God open hearts through the study of his Word. Another vital part of the Abel's ministry is Acampamento e Retiro Cristão da Associação (Christian Camp and Retreat Center of the Association) or ARCA for short, which has drawn hundreds of campers throughout the year. Because of the power of the Gospel, the Abels have seen lives changed in their time in Brazil, whether health issues, home life, or education.

They will also be participating in various types of mission training, including language training. They look forward to getting to know the Paraguayan culture and to becoming valuable partners with the Abels in church planting, making disciples, and pointing people to Christ.



Mafú described their ministry, "To preach Jesus Christ that people might come from darkness to light—from death to life... Evangelism and discipleship. This happens when people are gathered together around God's Word." The Abel family is looking forward to establishing Christ-centered churches in Paraguay, partnering with the church in Brazil, and growing a strong community of believers in South America.

A part of the faculty at the seminary in Campo Mourão, Jonathan believes in the importance of foundational training for the continued growth of healthy churches across Brazil. The Abels have planted the church they are currently serving in Maringá, along with two other congregations. Excited whenever they have the opportunity, Jonathan and Tamba share about the free gift of grace, often seeing Brazilians understand evangelical doctrines for the first time.

Sometimes it is just a place to stay while a single mother is in the hospital, other times the children are waiting for a new adopted family. Jonni and the other house moms strive to bring the Lord's healing to each child who comes through the door. She affirms, "Our primary calling is to be God's tool to minister His love and His healing into the lives of frightened and wounded children. Every kid that comes here, whether for a few days or for a year and a half, comes scared. They all have a hurt, and the One that will help them feel better is the Lord." Being used by God to share this healing with the children is Jonni's great joy.
