I had personal characteristics that were showing negative actions towards people that he brought up in a conversation with me one morning. Our conversations about this were fully out of love and I greatly appreciate him opening my eyes to it so that I can use his advice in my everyday life now. These conversations should be had with

people you are close with and this trip opened both of our hearts to make those kinds of conversations possible.

My dad and I also spent a night in one of the villages in Jinga with a local pastor for The Ambassador Institute. This pastor and his family spoke very little English, they lived lives so incredibly different from us, and they gave us food that we weren't exactly sure how it would impact our weak American stomachs. We both were out of our comfort zone but since we were together we now can carry those experiences into our conversations today. We learned the power of prayer, how to love others even better, and how to appreciate all the things we take for granted here in the U.S.

All in all, I learned more about myself and the Ugandan culture, and my relationship grew stronger with my dad in ways that could've only happened through this trip.
